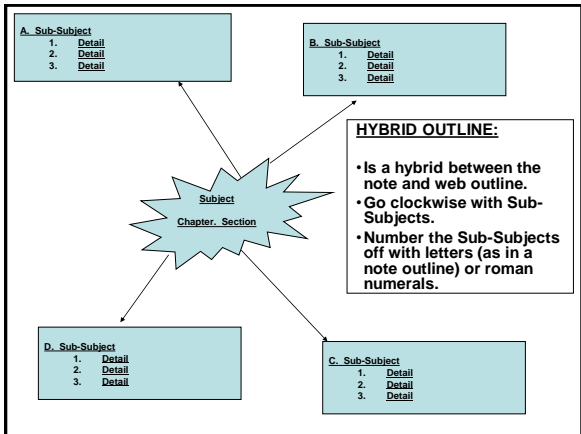
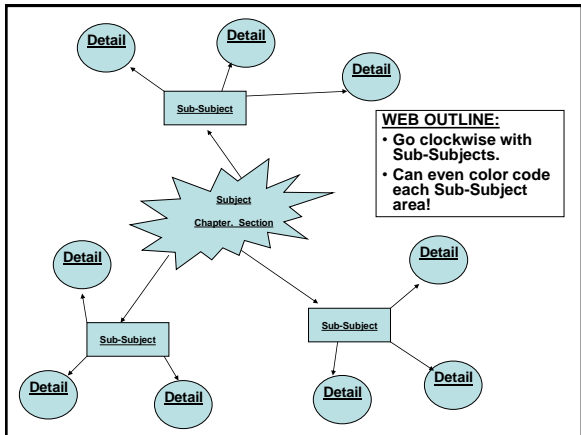

NOTE OUTLINE:

- The old fashion way to outline reading.
- Make sure to start a new Subject or Section with a new Roman Numeral (I, II, III, IV, V, VI) to show change in lecture or chapter.
 - When taking notes from book, use Chapter # and Section # after Roman Numeral in Subject/Section line.
 - EX: I. S/S Chp. 10.1
- At least three details, should be the most important detail to you, do not pull out random facts.
- Can be used for lectures or taking individual notes while reading.
